

## **Parsing Tool**


This is a set of training wheels, needed while the system is learning how to handle multiple Parts of Speech (a word can be a noun, a verb, a preposition), multiple forms (a verb may have half a dozen forms – transitive, etc) and multiple definitions. We don't think about these things it is all automatic – but the machine has to learn this - rather like a jigsaw puzzle, where the words can only fit together a certain way.




The window for parsing a sentence

#### First Pass Gives Us Possible Parts of Speech








